His first lobbying experience was with the Georgia Society of Ophthalmology, where he was named deputy director before the end of his first year. In 2002, David became a contract lobbyist and has since then successfully lobbied on behalf of corporations in numerous policy areas.

Civically, David is an active member and former board member of the University of Georgia Rugby Alumni Association; he also served as vice-chairman of the Sons of Marion Military Institute Foundation Board.
